
FRIENDS OF THE FESTIVAL is the more traditional membership program which supports the programming efforts of the organization.

LINDSEY WEBSTER

LINDSEY WEBSTER is an American jazz, R&B, and pop singer. Her first single, "Fool Me Once", reached number one on the Smooth Jazz chart at Billboard magazine (2016), making her the first vocalist since Sade's 2010 "Soldier of Love" to have a #1 vocallydriven song in the primarily

instrumental format. Since then Webster has scored six Top 5 hits, including "Where Do You Want To Go" (#1), Back To Your Heart (#2), Open Up (#3), Next To Me (#3), & Love Inside.

Webster was born in Woodstock, New York, and as a child played the cello. She became interested in singing and studied at the Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts. She released her first album independently in 2013. Webster will perform on the Main Stage on Friday, October 3, 2025 at 9:00 pm.

DYLAN TRIPLETT is a
Blues and Soul prodigy from
East Saint Louis. Raised
in a musical family, he
began performing at age 9
and has been performing
professionally since late 2016
when he began singing with
Ms. Carolyn Mason. With
his soulful voice and raw
emotion, he has captivated
audiences across the country
and around the globe. A
2023 Blues Award winner,

Dylan seamlessly combines classic blues elements with his unique style, creating a sound that's both timeless and contemporary. His electrifying performances, whether delivering heartfelt ballads or energizing the crowd with upbeat tunes, showcase his genuine talent undeniable charisma.

Dylan Triplett is a genuine talent in the field of modern

blues. He stands out from other artists in the genre thanks to his capacity to establish a meaningful and intimate connection with his listeners. Dylan Triplett exhibits his unquestionable talent and love for the blues with each word he sings. He will take the Main Stage at 9:00 pm on Saturday, October 4, 2025





Trying to describe Brave Combo's music requires a pretty extensive vocabulary – at least when it comes to musical styles. For the past three decades, the Denton-TX-based quintet has perfected a world music mix that includes salsa, meringue, rock, cumbia, conjunto, polka, zydeco, classical, cha cha, the blues, and more. They are America's Premier Dance band and a rollicking, rocking, rhythmic global journey — offering what one critic recently wrote, "Even if you come for the party, you'll leave with something of a musical education."

Brave Combo's catalog of recordings ranges from Japanese pop to Latin American dance tunes to orchestral classics to rock and roll at its finest. The band has recorded with the late Tiny Tim and was David Byrne's choice for his wed-

ding reception. From festivals and fairs across the globe, big and small rock clubs, colleges, roadhouses, dances, and cultural centers (including the annual Midsummer Night's Swing at Lincoln Center in New York City), Brave Combo has charmed countless listeners and won avid devotees. The band won two Grammy Awards and has been nominated for their work seven times.

Brave Combo's vivid music can be heard in the films David Byrne's True Stories, Clive Barker's Lord of Illusions, Late Bloomers, Fools Rush In, Envy, and The Academy Award-winning The Personals. They appeared at Oktoberfest in the beloved American burg of Springfield on an episode of The Simpsons. In 2008, Brave Combo provided the musical score for PBS's first-ever animated series, As the Wrench Turns, which resulted in an "Annie" nomination from the International Animated Film Society. Their music has also been featured on ABC's hit series Ugly Betty and Fox Television's Bakersfield P.D. They have also contributed original music for ESPN and The Big Ten network.

Brave Combo has performed at the Denton Arts and Jazz Festival every year since it began, and they will close the event on Sunday, October 5th at 7pm.


